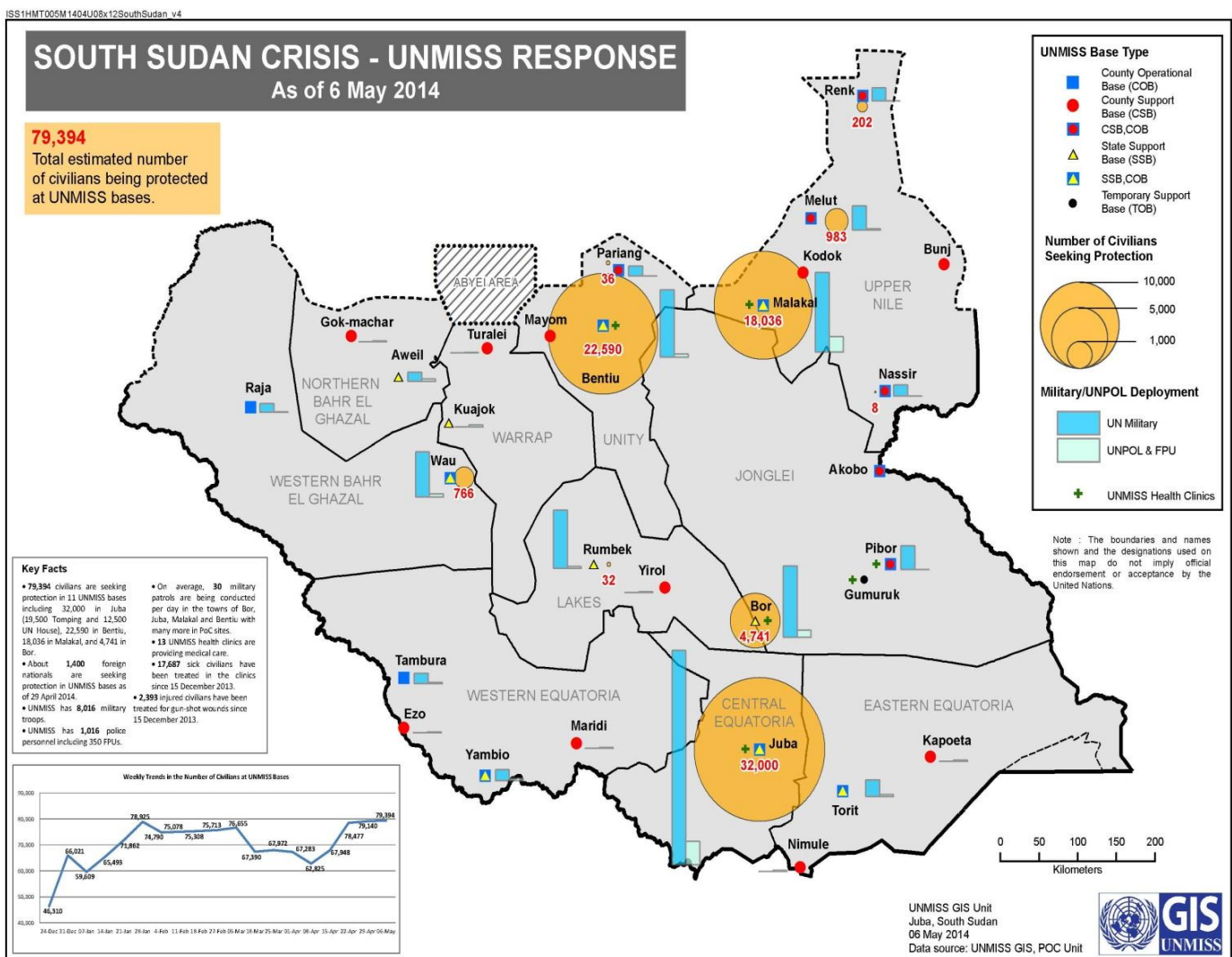

### UNMISS "PROTECTION OF CIVILIANS" (PoC) SITES I

- As of 7 May, the estimated number of civilians seeking safety in nine Protection of Civilians (PoC) sites located on UNMISS bases is 79,394. 32,000 in Juba (Tompson and UN House), 18,036 in Malakal, 4,741 in Bor, 22,590 in Bentiu, 766 in Wau, 983 in Melut, 202 in Renk, 8 in Nasser, 36 in Pariang and 32 in Rumbek.

## RELOCATION IN JUBA

With the expected closure in May of the UNMISS protection of civilians' site of Tomping, weather permitting, operations to relocate about 19,500 internally displaced persons (IDPs) to the UN House protection site continues.

Simultaneously, emergency work on the main drainage system to allow for improved hygiene conditions, as well as work on sanitation and latrines, are also ongoing.

*“As the new PoC 3 site nears completion, large-scale relocation will begin in May. We are working closely with the IDP community and we are seeing increasing support for relocation to UN House” the Deputy Special Representative of the UN Secretary General in South Sudan and UN Humanitarian Coordinator Toby Lanzer said.*

- Internally Displaced Persons leaders requested the scale-up of security in all protection of civilian sites after attack on Bor protection of civilian site.
